

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE USE OR POSSESSION OF GLASS BEVERAGE CONTAINERS UPON ANY PUBLIC BEACH SITUATED WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE VILLAGE OF JAMAICA BEACH, TEXAS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF JAMAICA BEACH, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to use or possess any glass beverage container in or upon any public beach area situated within the Corporate limits of the Village of Jamaica Beach, Texas.


SECTION 2 "Public Beach" Defined: "Public Beach" shall mean any beach area, whether publicly or privately owned, extending inland from the line of mean low tide to the line of vegetation bordering on the Gulf of Mexico.

SECTION 3. Penalties for violations of the provision of this statute will be assessed under Ordinance 76-6 adopted by the Village of Jamaica Beach on April 1, 1976.

SECTION 4. That the hereinbefore recited ordinance be enacted as 76-17 of the ordinances of the Village of Jamaica Beach, Texas.

SECTION 5. That this ordinance shall be and become effective from and after its adoption and publication as required by law.
