

ORDINANCE 77-10

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE INJURING, DAMAGING,  
OR DESTRUCTION OF PROPERTY BELONGING TO THE VILLAGE  
OF JAMAICA BEACH, TEXAS IN A WILLFUL OR WANTON MAN-  
NER AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF  
JAMAICA BEACH, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to act, or  
take any action which is so grossly negligent as to constitute will-  
ful, or wanton action, if by said act or action any village property  
is injured, damaged, or destroyed.


SECTION 2. The prohibition admonished in the preceeding Sec-  
tion shall be applicable whether the person involved perpetrates  
the same through the use of a vehicle or other instrument or not.


SECTION 3. Any person upon violation of the provisions of this  
Ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction, shall  
be fined in any sum not exceeding Two Hundred and No/100 Dollars.  
(\$200.00)

SECTION 4. That the hereinbefore recited ordinance be enacted  
as 77-10 of the Ordinances of the Village of Jamaica Beach, Texas.

SECTION 5. That this Ordinance shall be and become effective  
from and after the adoption and publication as required by law.
