

ORDINANCE 77-14

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE CONDUCTING OF CONCERTS, SPORTING EVENTS, CIRCUSES, CARNIVALS, PUBLIC DANCES, OR OTHER PUBLIC EXHIBITIONS WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE VILLAGE OF JAMAICA BEACH, TEXAS, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR FAILING TO COMPLY WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF JAMAICA BEACH, TEXAS.

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, corporation or other legal business entity, to conduct a concert, sporting event, circus, carnival, public dance, or other public exhibition on any public street, sidewalk, public beach, private beach, public building and/or residence within the corporate limits of Village of Jamaica Beach, Texas without first securing a permit from the City's secretary in accordance with the Ordinance 76-21 adopted by the Village of Jamaica Beach on Dec. 20, 1976.

SECTION 2. That in addition to the requirements set forth in said abovementioned Ordinance 76-21 every applicant shall furnish the village secretary both appropriate proof that the applicant has full authority to use or occupy the premises for the purpose stated in the application and a statement signed by the sponsor of the event, if any, that such sponsor has engaged the applicant to conduct the event.

SECTION 3. The village secretary shall not grant the permit if he shall find that granting the permit will be contrary to the public interest.

SECTION 4. In granting any permit under this Ordinance the City Secretary may establish requirements for both sufficient police and fire protection and it shall be unlawful for the holder of the permit to fail to comply with these requirements.

SECTION 5. Every applicant for a permit shall, as a condition ~~to the issuance of said permit, make an application fourteen days prior to the event~~ and post a cash deposit with the village secretary in any amount, not less than **\$250.00**, as may be set by the village council, which cash deposit shall secure to the village, and shall represent the applicant's promise, that the premises upon which the event shall take place shall be cleaned and policed so as to be free of litter and debris at the conclusion of the event.

said deposit shall be refunded to the permittee upon conclusion of the event and when a final inspection of the premises shows to the satisfaction of the village, or it's authorized agent, that said premises are safe, clean and free of filth and debris, and have been restored to as good a condition as it was prior to the event on the proviso, however, that should said premises not be restored within 5 days after the event, then a default of the provisions of this section shall be deemed to have occurred.


SECTION 6. Penalties for the violation of any act prohibited by this Ordinance will be assessed under Ordinance 76-6 as amended by Ordinance 77-1.

SECTION 7. That there hereinbefore recited Ordinance be enacted as Ordinance 77-14 of the Ordinances of the Village of Jamaica Beach, Texas.

SECTION 8. That this Ordinance shall be and become effective from and after it's adoption and publication as required by law.
